

Here's a website that let's you borrow books to read online for free, or do research on any topic, or find information about any topic. It is like an online library card. I checked out Charlotte's Web, and did some research in the "Wayback Machine" on machine knitting, where I found my own blog listed as a source of information. How to access the online library:

Search "openlibrary.org". Create a free account (your email and password). They send you a verification email and then you can log into your account in the Library. Search for any book you want to check out for free and add it to your list to read. You can read a few pages and then exit. When you log in again, it remembers where you left off. Or say you want to learn how to do weaving, or jewelry, or any topic. Go to "Search" function and enter what you want to find. You are then given many books to look through. This is a great resource for finding anything you are interested in, so check out a book and enjoy.
